

Tennis Etiquette Bendigo Tennis Association

It is important that all players conduct themselves in a way in which all participants can enjoy their tennis whilst still striving and competing to win each match. In addition to the <u>BTA By-Laws</u>, the following list provides a reminder to players of some simple actions that are required when playing tennis in all competitions:

- All standard rules of tennis and code of conduct always apply.
- To decide who will serve first, toss a coin or spin a racquet. The person who wins the toss may choose to serve, receive, pick which end of the court they would like or even make their opponent choose.
- Before you serve, make sure your opponent is ready to receive.
- Line calls must be made fairly and must be audible if there isn't a clear gap between the ball and the line, it's in!
- There is no such thing as 'play 2' for close line calls. If a player is unsure about a line call, it's in!
- A player must not touch/catch a ball before it has landed where it occurs, the player automatically loses the point, and it is awarded to the opposition.
- The score should be called out after each point typically by the server, but anyone can do it.
- Foot faulting is cheating! A player who is advised of foot-faulting must take action to remedy the cause and to serve fairly.
- It is often difficult to return balls to opponents under the nets at BRTC due to them being full length balls should therefore be gently and respectfully returned to players over the net.
- For safety, gently hit any "dead" balls on your court to the back fence.
- Don't walk behind another court during a point, across someone else's court while they're in the middle of a game or interrupt a point on another court to retrieve a ball.
- Play the game in the correct spirit and be respectful of your opponent/s.
- Racquet and verbal abuse will not be tolerated.
- Upon completion of the match, the scorecard must be completed and signed by both team captains and then submitted to the tournament box/office (if unattended, return to café) along with all balls issued for the match.
